

One of the most exciting projects now underway is a vital upgrade to our 77-year-old boys' pool, a beloved camp landmark that will welcome campers for Brantwood's 122nd summer season. The Boys' Camp Commons roof is currently being replaced, and this spring we will begin work on a new culvert on the Brantwood Road to protect it from the major rainstorms that have washed out the road. Message from the Interim Executive Director



Hello Brantwood Community! It is a pleasure to reconnect with you and to share that I returned to Brantwood as the Interim Executive Director! My Brantwood journey has taken many unexpected turns over the years, but finding myself back at Camp for the summer of 2026 may be the most surprising and gratifying development yet.

As I've settled back into the office, I've been struck by how much Brantwood has evolved since my retirement as Executive Director in 2014. We now have a second full-time, year-round staff member – Operations Director Robbie Welcome – and processes that once relied on paper are now fully online. These updated systems make it easier for families to register for camp, help us keep track of maintenance

needs and schedules, support our compliance with an increasing number of state reporting requirements, along with many other tasks involved in preparing for staff and campers to begin another summer at the 'best camp in the land.' Renovation of the 77 year old pool at the boys' campus has begun and is on track for completion by this summer – just in time for campers to enjoy refreshing swims all season long. With brand-new plumbing and a modern filtration system, the project will significantly improve water circulation and allow us to pass state pool inspection!

Leaders In Training Share Their Brantwood Experience

Brantwood's Leaders in Training (LIT) program is a special leadership development program for our oldest campers. It runs for the duration of each session and combines the fun of camp with age-appropriate responsibilities and leadership building activities to prepare for future roles as counselors. Guided by Permanent Counselors, these activities include learning water rescues and ropes course


skills as well as leading a campfire. Each term is capped off by the *Sunrise Hike* where the LITs leave camp before dawn to hike North Pack armed with head lamps and flashlights to cook breakfast at the peak and witness an unforgettable view. LITs are also asked to write an essay about their Brantwood experience and read it at Chapel during the final days of the term. Here are some excerpts from the LIT essays:

“ The first time I came to Brantwood I was excited because I was going to camp but I was scared because I was going to be with people I did not know. But everyone was really, really nice. Everyone had a different way of thinking but everyone respected each other. The counselors were always there to help you and reassure you and protect you.”



“ Brantwood has had a tremendous impact on me for the past 3 years. I loved how everyone was so competitive but also how supportive the campers were to each other. Camp has honestly taught me so much, such as thinking of others before myself and also not to get so upset when I lose and instead be happy for the other team.”

“ At Brantwood you live with other people you don't know for 2 weeks, 24 hours a day so you really get to know them. You become friends with them because of who you are, not what you have or who you know. I've learned so many new things. I really got to know myself and who I am and I have learned self-confidence, like how to go the extra mile at school and with my family.”



“ Each year I come to Brantwood I take home some precious things with me along with the Five Ideals. These are things I can feel and know in my heart such as happy memories, friendships, and most of all love. Not only for others but for myself as well.”

Campers enjoyed building trust with their cab-

inmates as they spotted each other on the Rope Course low elements. The LITs engaged in a team belaying exercise, building skills for their future as counselors. A highlight of the summer was the evening popsicle and movie night at the pool!

At the boy's camp, Director Tim Sullivan and Assistant Director Da'Jour Nesbeth cultivated an environment where campers and



counselors supported each other and served as role models and mentors. Ryan Moore returned as our Senior Program Director and Ryan Puliafico took on his new position as Junior Program Director. The enthusiasm and diversity of the boys' camp staff allowed us to offer exciting new opportunities for campers to gain valuable experience in carpentry lessons, nature-based learning, and wilderness skills which complemented their work completing their Challenges.

For campers at both ends of the Brantwood Road, the culminating test of the Challenge Program involves describing to a Permanent Counselor how they have learned to use the Five Ideals. I heard from many campers how Brantwood helped them grow as both individuals and team players. A consistent refrain was that what they loved most about Brantwood was the people.



No summer at Brantwood would be complete without our Alumni and Trustee volunteers who are always renewing their commitment to giving back to camp. 

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
